## **God's Value System**

This week we will continue to look at how to define a spiritually mature Christian. Growth is described in the Bible as transformation, changing the way we think and act. The basic change in thinking involves learning to think like God and orient our minds around God's value system. In the last two articles we explored some of the elements of God's value system by looking at Romans 12 and Eph 4. This week I want to explore God's value related to suffering. Christians take a unique perspective on suffering, viewing suffering as a necessary means of growth and refinement. James 1:2-4 says, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything." Here we see that God values spiritual growth and maturity more than the absence of trials and difficulties. Trials and difficulties can have a good result. When Paul wrote to the Corinthians he described his personal struggle against a "thorn" in his flesh, something that tormented Paul that Paul pleaded with God to remove. God didn't remove it, instead God said, "my grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Paul concludes from this, "Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. 10 That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." (2 Cor 12:6-10) God values growth more than ease of life, he values displaying his power in our weakness. God's power is displayed in our weakness when we approach our trails with patience, perseverance and an eternal perspective. God's power is displayed in our weakness when we seek growth from those trials instead of simply release. The world values strength, ease of life, freedom from pain, recognition from peers, and competence. God values the ability to demonstrate his power through our weakness.
